

## **Julio Cusihuaman. Evangelist to remote villages, prisons and the Bora Bora jungle tribe.**

Last December he wrote saying that he had reached 500 men for the Lord because of the help he has received through the CVT, mainly from St. John's BBH.

Julio has had an extremely difficult year. He has done fewer mission trips than usual because of a malaria outbreak in the Amazonian jungle and illness in his own family.

His two daughters and wife have all been ill with tuberculosis. All three are recovering, but his wife Vilma, who almost died, is recovering slowly. Prayers are needed for her.

In April he visited a village in the mountains where there was a wonderful conversion and reconciliation of a family.

In May he started his mission trip round the Amazonian jungle. 74 new brothers in the faith and several recommitted themselves.

In Iquitos 38 men came to the Lord and also 9 women. In the maximum security jail 8 men came to the Lord.

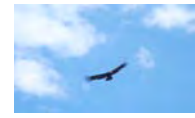
In Nauta 11 men came to the Lord, and in Rquena 8 men. Praise the Lord for His Grace!

In July he visited Yamanilla prison in Huamanga (Causaikucho) (the men there call for him from time to time to come and minister). There were 200 men at the meeting. 22 men accepted the altar call. Many made a decision to renew their commitment to the Lord when they saw the conversion of a father and son with deep tearful repentance. Julio took 40 Bibles and clothes and food.

In August he visited Tarma prison where 9 men accepted an altar call, 6 of which with many tears of repentance and loud groaning. He took Bibles to them. In Satipo prison 43 men made a decision for Christ. Praise the Lord indeed !.
